A Preacher's Perspective

s a self-confessed (and hopefully recovering) heart- grinch, I am frequently struck by how important it is to simply "think love."

I have shared with you on a few occasions, now, about the idea of mature Christian love which I

borrowed from Dallas Willard's Renovation of the Heart. Willard makes the observation that to have mature, spiritual love, four levels or dimensions of love have to be developed: First, we experience God's love for us. demonstrated in many ways but supremely by the giving of His Son. Second, we experience the love we feel for God as a response to His love. Third, we are directed to love one another as fellow members of Christ's body. Finally, we are to experience shared love together in a Christian community.

Now, those of us who tend to be introverts may have settled in on the idea that we can have a full relationship with God with a one-to-one love, irrespective of others. I have tended to view God that way. It's a private relationship which is more comfortable for

those of us who are relationship-challenged. But I think Willard is correct.

I believe that scripture is pretty clear that for us to know and love God as we should, we are forced to expand our hearts to take in the whole of the church. It doesn't make any sense, does it, to think of a body in which the head only had affection and love for its favorite body part? The wholeness of the "body" metaphor has profound application.

Now, I do love the inner, private relationship with God which is my more natural inclination. But if I truly trust and believe God, I must also believe that He has riches and blessings of love for me which are only available through my brothers and sisters.

Of course, I'm stretching the point a little here for


emphasis. I have always been blessed by the love I have shared with my brothers and sisters. But it is truly profound to me to realize that by focusing on you, by intentionally opening my heart to my family and my fellow believers, that I am actually drawing nearer to God.

Isn't it true that it's much easier to love God (whom we have not seen) than to love each other? I think we all share in that. And isn't it clear that Satan works overtime to steal our joy in God by preoccupying us with irritations with one another?

I challenge you to join me in trying to remember that the inner love you feel for God is only to be deepened and enriched as you commit yourself to deeper love for the family of God. We must be alert to Satan's schemes to divide us and break our

fellowship. He knows how much more powerful the Church of God is when we are bound together in genuine love.
