on't you just love love? We talked about love on Saturday. We loved our sweet Elizabeth Griffin and we celebrated the love we shared with her and the love she left for us to remember and cherish.

And, on Saturday, Chris Czernik's daughter Leanna was married to Sean DeMarre, and that special wedding-day love was a joy and a delight.

Young and fresh and beautiful and new.

Old and gracious and deep and rich.

In the wedding ceremony, we remind each other that the perfect love described in I Corinthians 13 is God's love, more perfect than we can really exhibit. It calls us to attain it, and it comforts us when we fall short. But it is just out of reach except by faith and by having it imputed to us by our God.

What an amazing thing that we should be invited to participate in the perfect love of God. It was the perfect love which died for us when we were still sinners. It was the perfect love which left the glory of heaven and emptied itself to redeem us from this "fearful, fallen place."

And the perfect love of God is the love which gives us confidence in the reality of our newly prepared mansion in company with our Savior and King and in fellowship with the saints of all the ages.

Love is to be the principle currency of the Kingdom. Love is to be the governing law of our realm and the binding arbiter in every decision. I like the way Paul expressed it in his letter to the Colossians: "And above all, put on love which binds everything together in perfect harmony."

Examine your heart and consider whether there are locks there, locks which may interfere with the giving or receiving of love. If so, ask the Holy Spirit to give you freedom to love others and to receive the love which God has "lavished upon us" in Christ Jesus.
